For the next few months, a variety of parishioners will be sharing their faith Stories. Why is faith important to them and why is the church important to them? Pat Davis starts us off for the month of August.

Why is my Faith Important?

It was through the church and through my parents' teachings that I learned to live by the scriptures and in particular the Golden Rule. Faith and my love of God taught me a way of life that has taken me through several challenges and hardships in my life and I have been able to come out the other side not unscathed but stronger and still standing. My faith and these life experiences/challenges have developed who I am as a Christian. My faith has brought me to calm and purpose at times when I was unsure and quite frankly feeling a sense of despair. When I did not think, I could talk to my family or friends because I did not think they would

understand, I could talk to God, and I knew he would always listen.

The most difficult time in my life has been the death of my son Ryan. But through it all, I knew God was with me and with Ryan too. During a counseling session, I was asked if I believed in God. I answered an emphatic, "Yes!" Then he asked if I blamed God for Ryan's death to which I replied, "Absolutely not!" I knew God did not create the circumstances surrounding Ryan's death, but I absolutely knew that the Trinity was there in full force to receive him.

My faith requires me to be my brother's keeper and over the years I have tried to find different ways to assist those less fortunate but by doing so I have actually helped myself. My faith became stronger and my joy for helping others grew. However, as age overtakes me, I have had to find less strenuous ways of continuing this. I am still growing as a Christian and will until the day that I die, and I am very far from perfection but I believe that that is all God requires of us — to keep trying and moving forward on the path that he has set for us even though we have no idea what that may be. What a journey! We will see one day, I guess how close we came to the path he actually chose for us and how many detours we made.

How has the church strengthened my faith?

The church is very important to me in two ways. I defined church, as the community of church and the building of where "church" happens. The building has provided me with a calming familiarity since childhood since I am a cradle Anglican and have attended St James (later St James and St Brendan) since my birth with the exception of a few years during my first marriage.

However, no other Anglican church I attended ever felt like home. I expect it was the stained-glass windows, the layout of the building, the traditions, the familiar liturgies, and of course it should go without saying, the people, especially the ones our family has known since childhood.

But the most important thing to me is the involvement over the years in the church activities and the people with whom it connected me, from the early years of Sunday School, JA, Junior Choir to present years of Diocesan work, Office Administrator, and Layreader etc. As each new role was added, and the tasks and responsibilities broadened my knowledge and appreciation, my faith blossomed. My connection with the people of the parish and in the community expanded and was so varied and so my faith grew.

During the liturgy, which I love, the Prayers of the People are a blessing for me as they provide an opportunity for us to pray for each other and remember those in need of prayer as well as the world needs. So, we are never very far from each other in our hearts. That to me is huge. And faith grows.

The community of St J&B has provided me with a treasure trove of friends and acquaintances that are near and dear to my heart and have by their involvement in my life in immeasurable ways made it richer and more rewarding and I wouldn't change that experience for the world. Pat D.



Starting Monday, September 11th running until Monday, October 30th there will be two sessions to study this book together.


