### My Dearest Siblings,

Once again, we are entering into one of our many beautiful seasons. It is the Holy Season of Advent. What is Advent? Well, the simple answer is that Advent is a period of preparation. We spend the next four weeks preparing to celebrate Jesus's birth. It is also when we prepare for Jesus' second coming. Advent is a spiritual journey. However, if we do not know what Christmas means, we will fail to understand what Advent is for.

So, what does Christmas mean to you? During the First Sunday of Advent, Jesus talks about the world and the Last Judgement when He comes in glory. Jesus encourages us to be ready and remember that we never really know when he will return; therefore, we should always be prepared. One might think it strange to begin Advent by focusing on the end of the world and the second coming of Jesus. However, it is Jesus' second coming that we always need to prepare for, and what better way to start the new year than by reminding ourselves of that and reflecting on how we can improve our lives? Christmas is not just a day that reminds us of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem; it is also a day to prompt us and prepare us for our final encounter with Jesus.

In the Book of John's Revelation, we read, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come into him and eat with him, and he with me." Rev.3: 20

Are you listening for the knock on the door? How are you preparing for Christmas? For many of us, it is

about buying presents, decorating the house and family get-togethers. Please hear me when I say there is **nothing** wrong with any of this, as long as we remember the spiritual part of Christmas and not allow it to get lost in all the festivities. Over the next four weeks, I invite you to reflect on:

- How much God loved you.
- What does it mean to you that God sent His own Son to be born for each of us? To feel pain and love just as we do.
- What does it mean to you that Jesus came to show us the face of God through his death and resurrection?

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16

When we reflect on God's love for us, we are encouraged to reply to God's love, and the best part is that we do not have to struggle with an answer, for Jesus told us how to respond when he said:

I give you a new commandment that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. John 13:34

When we can Love our neighbour as Jesus has loved us, then we can demonstrate our Love for God, and when we can show that love, we are living according to what James says in his letter.

So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless. James 2:17

Faith is found in action, words and deeds.







(b), (i) and (ii). (amended, 1986)
