

My Dear Friends in Christ,

As we continue on our Lenten journey of Lent, I hope and pray that this time brings you true solace. Every year when Lent arrives, we are invited to take some time to reflect on our lives and see where the Holy Spirit is calling you to. I am wondering if when you first heard the invitation you thought to yourself, "Well Lent is here again and here are the things I am going to give up or do extra to get through Lent."

I hope that was not your thought because really it is not about us getting through Lent, really it is a matter of Lent getting through to you. Most of us consider Lent as a penitential season; unfortunately, the word penitential is often misunderstood, and Lent is looked at as a season filled with guilt, shame, regret and disappointment.

However, Lent is not about guilt, shame or regret. Think about the first sentence of the opening prayer in the Ash Wednesday Service. It says, "Almighty and everlasting God, you hate nothing you have made...." Now, if this is true and this is God's attitude, then it should not also be ours. St. Irenaeus, a bishop of the second century, once said. "What God creates, God loves; and what God loves, God loves everlastingly."

These words we need to hear. These words we need to listen to and take to heart. These words are so important and they are applicable to everyone, those who we love, and to those we do not like, and to those we do not even know. The Lenten is one of the greatest invitations a person can receive, for it is an invitation to discover something new about ourselves and live into our true authentic selves and our true identity as a child of

God. We are meant to remember who we are in God and who we are with God and the answer is a beloved child of God.

Lent invites us to look at the ways in which we have allowed our fears, attitudes, behaviors, our accomplishments, successes and failures, as well as the opinions of others, to dictate who we are, therefore separating us from God, ourselves, and each other.

Lent invites us to repent of, fast from, and let go of all the false identities that We have swirling around in our head and remember and recover our true selves as God's holy people, who are all created in the image and likeness of God.

Have a Blessed Lent, everyone.





- ➤ adhere to all Health & Safety regulations and reporting.




