Report on Our Organ

It is no secret that St J & B is a church with a heart for outreach in the city of Port Colborne. This is demonstrated in past and ongoing actions, whether through the purchase of the park property to "Bless the City", or the ongoing "Food with Friends" program.

Yet, St. J & B is also a church that seeks to worship God in the beauty of holiness: the handsome building, liturgy, pipe organ, and gifted and dedicated choir all stand in testament to this. We are Anglicans, and this means we have a truly unique approach to worshipping God. We seek to love each other, and our God through a tradition that utilizes a wonderful blend of choral and hymn singing, all accompanied by a uniquely sacred instrument, the pipe organ. This instrument is uniquely capable of evoking grandeur, intimacy, power, prayer, and awe, and ideally helps to provide a setting where we can uniquely encounter God in the modern world, which is often hostile to beauty and sacred worship.

For many more than 65 years, the current pipe organ has done just this. It has served this congregation well and faithfully. We don't know when the instrument was moved here from its former home (it was brought here as a used instrument), but in 1960, the church first sought quotes to replace or rebuild the instrument. Again in 1970 efforts were made at replacement without success. At this time, a new console (keyboard, or central control) was added to the organ.

Since 1960 and 1970, when quotes were first sought to replace the old organ, two additional major issues have affected the organ's functionality; these center on the electronics, and damage to the Great Wind Chest. In 2004 the first of a series of persistent water leaks damaged the Great division; subsequent drying and cracking has permanently reduced the playability of the Great organ (the main body of an organ) by 30%. In 2004 and 2006 Blair Batty attempted unsuccessfully to repair this damage. In 2021 two separate technicians, Bruce Cross and Jim Dodington also explored the situation and found the Great Windchest unrepairable.

The second main problem with the organ is the heavily worn and aging electrical components that date back to 1971. Electronics are the central control that enables an organ to play. As we all know, electronics have a defined life expectancy. The organ service record book reports numerous instances of faults and repairing these repeatedly does not address the fact that many of the electrical components of the organ have already reached the end of their life.

I am most grateful to be able to play at St J & B, and to support the strong musical tradition that has been established here. At this time, it is my hope that the parish will consider that the time has come to consider replacing the current pipe organ. Perhaps considering

that the instrument has now faithfully lived out the full extent of its life would be both a commitment to our worship of Almighty God and allow for the possibility for outreach into the community. I welcome the opportunity to discuss this with anyone who would like to do so.


My Dear Siblings,
