For the next few months, a variety of parishioners will be sharing their faith Stories. Why is faith important to them and why is the church important to them? For September we thank Tami for sharing her faith.

Why is my faith important? How has the Church Strengthened my faith?

I grew up learning a lot about Jesus. I went to church, Sunday School, mid-week kids club, and youth group. My parents were committed Christians and encouraged me to follow Jesus, too. So, I did, at least in part because it was important to my family. Over time, it became more important to me, too. John 6:67-69 says, "Then Jesus turned to the Twelve and asked, 'Are you also going to leave?' Simon Peter replied, 'Lord, to whom would we go? You have the words that give eternal life. We believe, and we know you are the Holy One of God." These verses encapsulate why I am a Christian. Once, when I was in a deep depression, I thought of abandoning my faith altogether. I couldn't sense God at all in any way. But as I reflected on where I had been and looked toward the future, I could not imagine life without God, even if at that moment I could not detect God's presence. I still have doubts

sometimes. But like Peter, I ask, 'where would I go?' Life without God doesn't make sense. I have been part of many kinds of churches over the years. I grew up in an Evangelical Mennonite church, attended Pentecostal and Baptist churches while living in the UK, and now I am here at the Anglican church. I consider this a privilege because I have experienced what it is like to worship God in many ways. In each church tradition, I see strengths and weaknesses, but mostly people do their best to pursue God in their lives.

Each church has helped me grow in my faith. My childhood church taught me the importance of studying and memorizing the Scriptures and inviting God into all parts of my life. The Baptist church taught me about sharing my faith boldly. At the Pentecostal church, I learned how to be freer in my worship and celebrate life with God. With the Anglicans, I have learned the importance of tradition and witnessed the beauty of liturgy. God is not confined to one church tradition but meets people where they are at.


