You are invited to participate in a Care for Our Common Home Retreat at Jericho House, June21-23, 2024.

Organized in collaboration with Jericho House and the Mouvement Laudato Si' Movement - Canada



The retreat's context is Laudato Si's Action Platform focus, " Ecological Economics", and offers a time for kindred spirits from multiple faiths and non-faith traditions to explore how to respond to ecological crises. The retreat is open to residential, and commuter participation, and includes opportunities for:

- small and large group discussions
- . personal and group reflection
- community building .

- contemplative practice
- action and advocacy networking
- storytelling

The focus of this retreat is drawn from the knowledge and experience of the participants: Laudato Si' Animators, municipal environmental planners, educators, faith inspired environmentalists, participants at United Nations conferences COP 28 and COP16, and others.

The retreat begins with dinner at 5:30 on Friday and ends with lunch on Sunday. The participants' cost for residential participation(double occupancy probable) is \$270.00, and commuter \$240.00, lericho House's grant enables the fee to be simply a "free will" offering.

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One:

Regarding private confession in the Anglican Church, there is a saying. "All may, some should, none must" but if you do, the *priest is bound by the seal of confession* and *can never repeat your confession*.

Two:

Did you also know that we are synodically governed and episcopally led? This means that decisions are taken democratically and at the same time Anglicans always look to their bishops for guidance and as a focus of unity.

Lastly Our beliefs as Anglicans:

Our mission statement: As a partner in the worldwide Anglican Communion and in the universal Church, we proclaim and celebrate the gospel of Jesus Christ in worship and action. We value our heritage of biblical faith, reason, liturgy, tradition, bishops and synods, and the rich variety of our life in community. We acknowledge that God is calling us to a greater diversity of membership, wider participation in ministry and leadership, better stewardship in God's creation, and a stronger resolve in challenging attitudes and structures that cause injustice. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves to respond to this call-in love and service and so more fully live the life of Christ. The Anglican Church of Canada does not define its doctrine in a single confession. Our beliefs are articulated in our liturgies, as well as in these selected statements:

- Anglican tradition affirms three historic creeds: the <u>Apostles' Creed</u>, the <u>Nicene Creed</u>, and the <u>Athanasian Creed</u>.
- The <u>Solemn Declaration</u> (1893) united the Anglican Church of Canada as a national church and defined its relationship to the worldwide Anglican Communion.
- The Lambeth Quadrilateral (1888) defined the commonalities of churches in the Anglican Communion and has also served as a basis for ecumenical discussion.
- The <u>39 Articles of Religion</u> were a foundational document for the Church of England during the Reformation.
- Current work at General Synod is shaped by the <u>Five Marks of Mission</u>, used widely throughout the Anglican Communion.
